

# It's Time to Role-Play!

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Pick one of the following scenarios and act it out with your teacher or another student.

<p>SCENARIO</p> <p>1</p>	<p>Your teacher has just handed out an assignment and you are required to have six different sources. You are a very slow reader. You have been doing well in the course so far this semester. You want to ask the teacher to reduce the required number of sources.</p>
<p>SCENARIO</p> <p>2</p>	<p>Your math teacher has assigned a large number of questions for homework on a topic that you are finding difficult. You want to ask the teacher to reduce the required amount of questions and you also want to request a sample question.</p>
<p>SCENARIO</p> <p>3</p>	<p>Your English teacher has told the class that you will be writing an in-class essay later that week. Your written work is very difficult to read and you find it easier to think and write when you word-process a paper. You want to use a computer to do this essay. How will you make this request?</p>
<p>SCENARIO</p> <p>4</p>	<p>Your class takes place during lunch hour and the classroom is near the cafeteria. You can see students walking into and out of the cafeteria all period. You want to move to a seat where you won't be distracted; however, your teacher has assigned the seats and you don't think she will be receptive to your moving. How will you ask to change seats?</p>
